Officer Jurgens-Duenas had nothing to report for beat 13X and did not bring stats. My monthly stats show relatively little crime for 13X except for 7 non-auto related property crimes in both June and July.

**Neighborhood Issues**

Lisa Jacobs, from Dan Kalb’s office, reported that their office has heard of a recent increase in violent crimes in the Longfellow area (around 40<sup>th</sup>), and wondered if we had such an increase here. We reported that our beats (especially 12Y) saw an increase of crimes against the person in June (a maximum for 2019), but it dropped off in July.

Lisa Jacobs also reported a new homeless person at the end of Miles (at Forest, but not under the 24 intersection). The person has been seen exposing himself, and urinating in yards at the intersection of Forest and Oak Grove. There is also a new homeless man living on Forest under the 24 overpass, where Shane and his

partner sometimes stay. Officer Mac has reached out directly to the reporting resident asking for more information.

Mike Ubell asked Lisa Jacobs about the traffic circles on Shafter. Lisa said it's their office's #1 priority. They want signs that say "yield to traffic in circle" on all sides of the intersections, and shark's teeth before the traffic circles. "Shark's teeth" (you've seen them) mean "slow down and yield." Right now there are no traffic control signs on Shafter at the traffic circles but the cross streets all have stop signs. This is confusing to drivers.

### **Priorities**

Lisa Jacobs reports that Mr. Kalb's office is trying to get OakDOT to work on the crosswalk at Broadway Terrace & Hermosa (NCPC's 13X priority). They're also asking the city to trim the trees, which the city will now *only* do in an emergency. No new priorities were suggested.
